

#### From the Rabbi

As August begins, we can't help but want to savor every last bit of the summer! We also look forward to the High Holidays in the fall. The last Hebrew month of the year is named, Elul or אלול. This month begins on Saturday night August 11.

The rabbis understand the name of month, Elul to be an acronym for *ani l'dodi v'dodi li*, אני לדודי ודודי לי, I am for My beloved and My beloved is for me (Song of Songs 6:3).

During Elul, we are charged with examining our relationships. We look, with love, at where we need to grow and be better. The verse starts with the personal "ani, I," it is telling us, "I am connected to other people and **then** they are connected to me." We have to work on our own deficits if we want to grow, be, and do better. Helping others starts with us.

Yet, we cannot forget the second part, "My beloved is for me." God created people to be in relationship with each other. We must be for others and they must be for us. It can be extremely difficult to ask for help. Yet, in this month of Elul, God is telling us that we must help others but we ALSO must accept help from others. Neither is easy. This is why we have an entire month dedicated to working on it!

As we move into the season of the High Holidays, remember that God has created us to be with each other and with God. I challenge you, every day, starting August 12, do one small thing every day just for you AND do one thing for someone else. 


