#### From the Rabbi

In this season of giving thanks, let me share with you a beautiful story.

A baby was born at the Rambaum Medical Center in Haifa. Unfortunately, soon after the baby's birth, he suffered severe seizures and was transferred to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit immediately.

Dr. Hanna Mandel, a metabolic disease specialist was the head of the unit who first assessed the baby. Many different tests were performed and they all came back negative. When the baby was sent for brain scans the images showed a lack of myelin, which is a coating around nerves, that acts like plastic insulation around an electrical wire. Without that insulation, the wires, the neurons, cannot carry a signal as far or as fast. So as the child grew older, his development lagged; he could not move on his own.

At 4 years old, Dr. Orly Elpeleg, a specialist in rare genetic diseases at Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center in Jerusalem, led a team that analyzed the boy's genome. They were looking for mutations that might have caused this. They found a mutation that had never been found in any person, up until that point. Dr. Elpeleg contacted an expert on the specific gene at a Brain Science Institute in Japan. The Israeli team sent a sample of the child's tissue to the Japanese team and together they solved the genetic piece of the child's sickness. With better understanding of the problem and a diagnosis, the child receives greater medical support, and his parents have received genetic counseling about future pregnancies.

Despite many difficulties, Dr. Mandel speaks of the positive pieces of this child's life. She says, "He lives in a beautiful Arab village in Northern Israel in a beautiful house with his parents and sister. During the day, he attends a rehabilitation center near his home village, where he receives all the paramedical support one could think of."

An Arab family, Israeli, Japanese and British doctors have come together to start to solve a genetic mystery and to help a child. The ingenuity of the doctors, their collaboration and desire to make our world better are just some of the reasons among many to be thankful.
